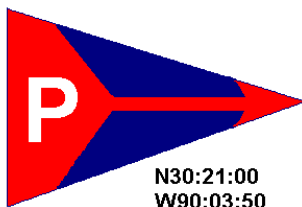


Commodore's Corner - Tom Quinlan

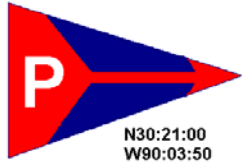


2008 CANDIDATES FOR THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

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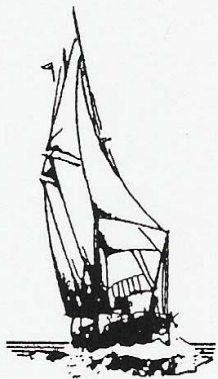

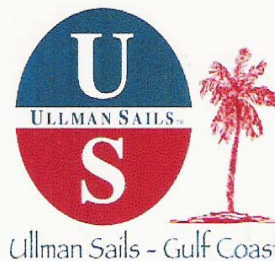
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
