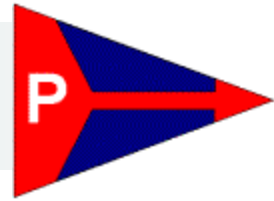

For most of this month I've been in St. Augustine, Florida renovating my deceased father-in-law's house. So I haven't been at the club for some time.

Joe recommended a company that specializes in rust inhibiting primers. We painted one 18'-0 section of the railing to see how this product from Norway performs, if satisfactory, we'll continue the railing and doors.

I'll be returning to Florida in mid- February to finish the house and put it on the market.

When I return, I'll be calling on volunteers to assist in the restoration of the railing and doors, which is a major part of the maintenance project that was estimated to cost \$15,000 to \$20,000.
